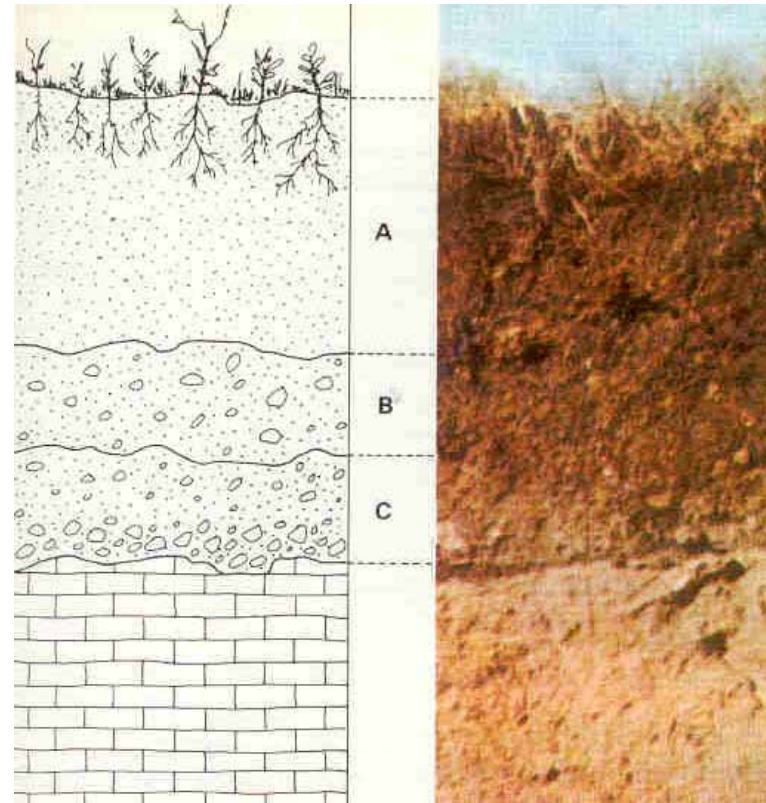
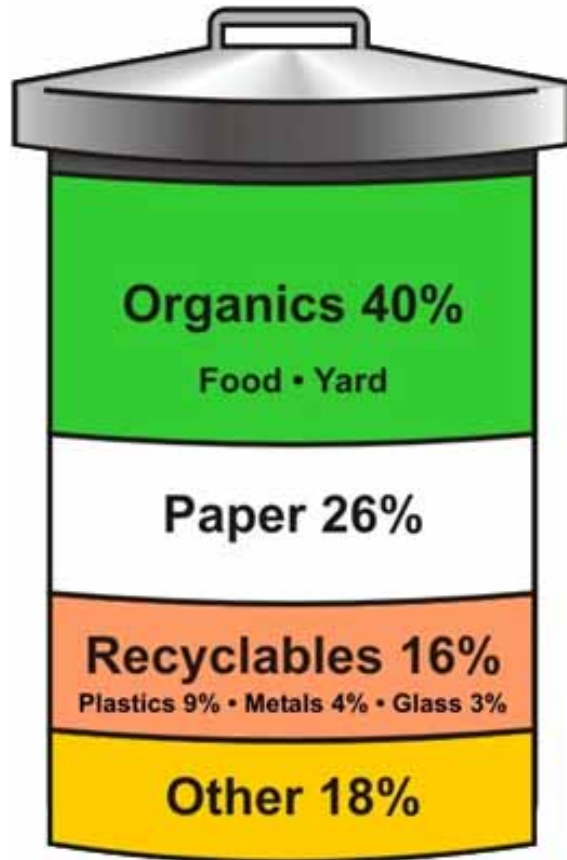

To develop the distribution logistics infrastructure for ongoing access to compost supply

- side-by-side field plots, comparing greenbin-derived compost to regular fertilizer program
- two year trial involving upfront & ongoing soil testing, yield analysis
- assessment of logistics and development of networks for access to compost and its incorporation in soil

Greenhouse & Compost Demonstration Centre

The Stop's Green Barn is a heritage building re-designed to Gold LEED environmental standards that grows year-round organic produce. The Green Barn houses a 3,000-square-foot state-of-the-art greenhouse in which we grow a variety of produce including kale, Swiss chard, lettuce, herbs, tomatoes, eggplant, peppers, grapefruit, pineapple, Meyer lemons, Mizuna mustard, baby bok choy, chilies, nasturtiums, geraniums, bananas, oranges, avocado, cassava, taro, sweet potato, Indian spinach, jade, lemon balm, figs, marigold, tamarind, radishes, sprouts, callaloo, aloe vera and olive. The food we grow in the greenhouse is split between our programs, volunteers and our food bank.

Greenhouse facts:

- 220 lbs of produce were harvested in the greenhouse in 2009. That amount increased more than five-fold, to 1,310 lbs, in 2010.
- Number of vermicompost bins sited by volunteers in 2011: 186
- Number of seedlings grown for community gardens across Toronto in 2011: 18,250
- Amount of soil/compost purchased in 2011: None, representing a savings of \$5,480!

Our **compost demonstration centre** produces much-needed compost for our greenhouse. Large composting units and vermicomposting bins serve a triple purpose – to divert food waste from landfill, turn it into a rich growing medium for greenhouse plants and to teach the value and methods of composting to Green Barn visitors. The worms in the composting bins are popular with kids and are great ambassadors for the world of biodiversity.

With the help of kids in our After School Program and volunteers, we're also building a **seed bank**. In the fall of 2011, we gave away 400 kale seedlings 400 kale seedlings grown from seed saved from our own plants.

Topics

Topsoil Removal

Topsoil is essential to viable plant growth and its natural formation in Ontario has required thousands of years. The high productivity of much of Ontario's land is due in large part to its topsoil resources.

Topsoil serves as a stabilizing medium, and a nutrient and moisture source for plant growth. Removal of topsoil from agricultural and natural landscapes permanently depresses land productivity. Topsoil removal destabilizes landscapes, increasing the potential for wind and water erosion.

A new *Municipal Act 2001* for the Province of Ontario came into force on January 1, 2003 and outlined several changes in a municipality's ability to deal with the issue of topsoil removal.

Site alteration provisions continue the authority for local municipalities to prohibit or regulate the placing or dumping of fill and the alteration of grades. The new Act also allows local municipalities to prohibit or regulate the removal of topsoil, integrating the provisions of the old *Topsoil Preservation Act* that has since been repealed.

The new Act clearly defines "topsoil" as:

those horizons in a soil profile, commonly known as the "O" and the "A" horizons, containing organic material and includes deposits of partially decomposed organic matter such as peat. 2001, c. 25, s. 142 (1).

The Ontario Ministry of Agriculture and Food supports the passage of municipal by-laws which protect agricultural and natural landscapes and topsoil resources.
