SPOTLIGHT ON SASKATOON

- <u>Saskatoon's Green Cart program</u> is an optional, fee-for-service, biweekly for single family households with existing curbside pickup
- Yard, food waste, food soiled paper, wooden tableware, cardboard/newsprint, etc
- Charged seasonally (i.e. not per use)

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• Available also for community gardens



SPOTLIGHT ON SMALLER CITIES

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- Ladysmith, BC was the first municipality in the province to collect recyclables curbside, and their organics program started in 2006.
- Vying with **Grand Forks**, **BC** for claim to first curbside organics program
- An entrepreneurial resident of **Iqaluit**, Nunavut collected food scraps for composting between 2004 and 2013
- The Village of Cumberland, BC requires residents provide their own bins for collection

SPOTLIGHT ON LARGER CITIES

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- Toronto, ON uses thigh-high green totes for curbside with a locking lid designed to frustrate nimble-fingered rodents
- Edmonton, AB comingled yard and food waste with the trash waste stream, and separated at the facility (until it closed!) – they announced an upcoming Green Cart rollout in Sept 2019
- **Regina, SK** aims to launch its first organics collection program in spring 2020

SPOTLIGHT – METRO VANCOUVER

- Region serves 52.9% of BC population
- Organics ban in 2015
- Odour issues with largest regional processor led to halving intake, then closure circa 2017/2018
- Organics temporarily released to landfill, including cross-border
- Mid-term impacts showing growth in remaining processors' capacity

BUY BETTER

PLANNING AND PREPARING

- Take the time to get it right the first time. Once collection is in place, residents expect it.
- Expect to ask and answer...
 - O Private or public hauling and processing (any backups?)
 O Vehicle type (hint: split, automated)
 - Sector(s)
 - o Bin sizes and types (hint: start small)
 - \circ Location of pilot
 - Initial target audience
 - Accepted items/products/feedstock



MAKING THE CASE

Environmental & Cost Appeal

- Infographic: Food Loss and Waste (CEC) (and <u>accompanying report</u>)
- Project Drawdown: <u>Composting Food</u>
- Successful case studies featured on <u>Gov't of BC website</u>
- Conduct a Waste Composition Study –
 Expect increased diversion from landfill from 30% to 50%+
- Leverage federal infrastructure funds

SOURCING AND PLANNING SERVICES

HAULING

- Check with existing haulers if they can expand services
- Use every other week garbage pickup along with weekly organics pickup
- Select a variety of carts for pilot, and track user preferences before placing an order to scale
- Tons of resources are readily available e.g. <u>Guide to estimate bins required for weekly</u> <u>recycling/garbage pickup in MF buildings</u> (Metro Van)



SOURCING AND PLANNING SERVICES

PROCESSING

- Encourage backyard compositing where possible
- Small to mid-range open windrows are a great place to start for central processing
- Consider co-locating organics processing with landfill in rural areas
- Get odour under control from the start



WHAT'S IN / OUT

- Start conservatively; it's hard to backtrack
- Most programs include food soiled paper
- Base additional material acceptance on the processor's most conservative threshold
- Go beyond certification consider testing compostable product disintegration on site







COMPOSTABLE FIELD TESTING PROGRAM

- Non-profit, open source, free of charge
- Multi-stakeholder, international
- Standard materials tested in all facilities, custom products at facility's discretion
- Encourages diversity: scalable to any size facility, anonymized by default
- Platform for research and education

INFORMING & EDUCATING - TIPS

- Communicate from start, to finish (i.e. from planning to scaling)
- Involve sectors beyond your target audience they'll eventually be affected, and individuals will move between sectors throughout their life
- Prepare multi-lingual materials
- Use consistent colours between sectors and within regions

INFORMING & EDUCATING - AVENUES

- Door to Door outreach
- Presentations given at schools "very successful"
- Ad and articles in local papers, local radio and TV stations
- Media coverage / press releases
- Posters
- Localized custom website
- "Campaign kit" pamphlet, poster, bin tags, door hangers

INFORMING & EDUCATING - INCLUDE

- What's accepted and what's not!
- Collection schedule
- The WHY behind the change, the bigger picture
- Summary of costs
- Invitation for feedback
