**Major Nutrients** - Compost is classified in Schedule II (CFIA Fertilizer Act & Regulations) as a supplement, and as such, nutrient guarantees are not mandatory. However, if any claims are made regarding nutritional value of the product, such as for composted manure, the product would then be classified as a supplement and a fertilizer, and the label would have to include the guarantees for the major nutrients. The guarantees for the major nutrients include the minimum amounts of Total Nitrogen (N), Available Phosphoric Acid (P<sub>2</sub>O<sub>5</sub>) and Soluble Potash (K<sub>2</sub>O).
