Since 2019, through vision, partnerships, hard work and stoic determination, 15 acres of underutilized industrial land have been transformed into a vibrant, biodiverse space that produces nutrient-dense food, supports ecological restoration and welcomes thousands of Calgarians each year for hands-on learning and meaningful contribution. "Highfield Regenerative Farm is a statement for what we believe in – local food, strengthening

community and doing so on a foundation of sustainability," said Jeremy Zoller, one of the farm's foundational catalysts and urban agriculture advocate. "The strength and teamwork of many are responsible for this remarkable initiative whose accomplishments are many with much more still to come."

The farm has become a city-wide model of urban sustainability, offering a blueprint for turning

overlooked spaces into thriving, productive ecosystems. In 2023, Highfield Regenerative Farm was honoured with an Emerald Award—Alberta's most prestigious environmental recognition—for its outstanding work in soil regeneration, composting, food security and inclusive community programming. "Highfield Regenerative Farm is Calgary's first large-scale urban farm on vacant City-owned land and was launched as a pilot project as The City developed the Growing Spaces Urban

Agriculture Program," said Kristi Peters, Food Systems Planner, City of Calgary. "The success of the farm has contributed to the development of the Growing Spaces Program, which will continue to support urban agriculture and urban farmers in other locations throughout the





While the Highfield Farm project will conclude at this location after its current term, our work is far from over. We remain committed to urban agriculture and community-driven sustainability


